



Suffix

A <u>suffix</u> is a letter or a group of letters attached to the end of a word to form a new word or to alter the grammatical function of the original word. For example, the verb *read* can be made into the noun *reader* by adding the suffix - *er*; *read* can be made into the adjective *readable* by adding the suffix *-able*.

Understanding the meanings of the common suffixes can help us deduce the meanings of new words that we encounter. The table below defines and illustrates common suffixes.



Noun Suffixes
