It is commonly found in both the developed and developing world. The **risk** of having chronic diseases is higher among those who sit still more than 5 hours per day. 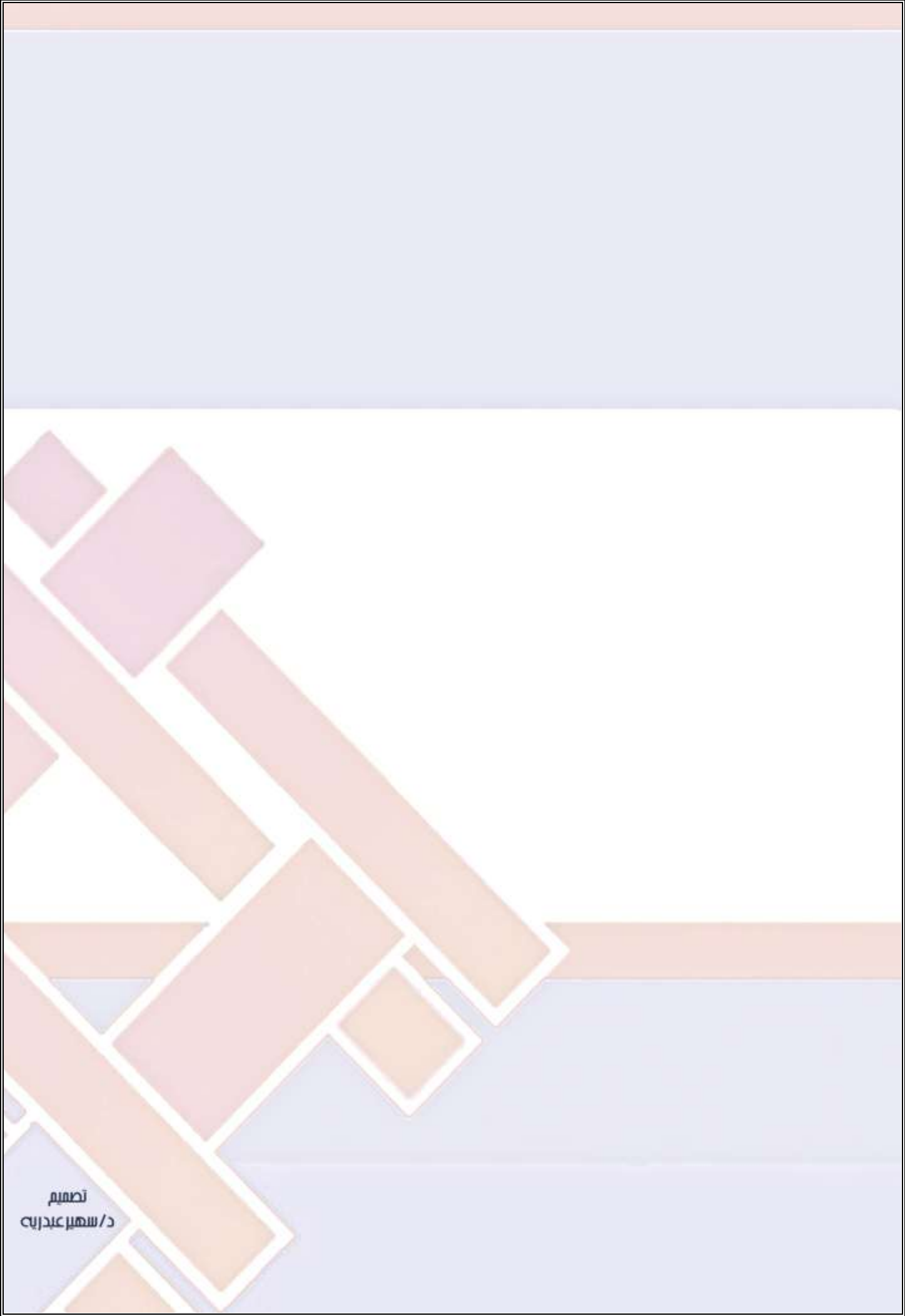

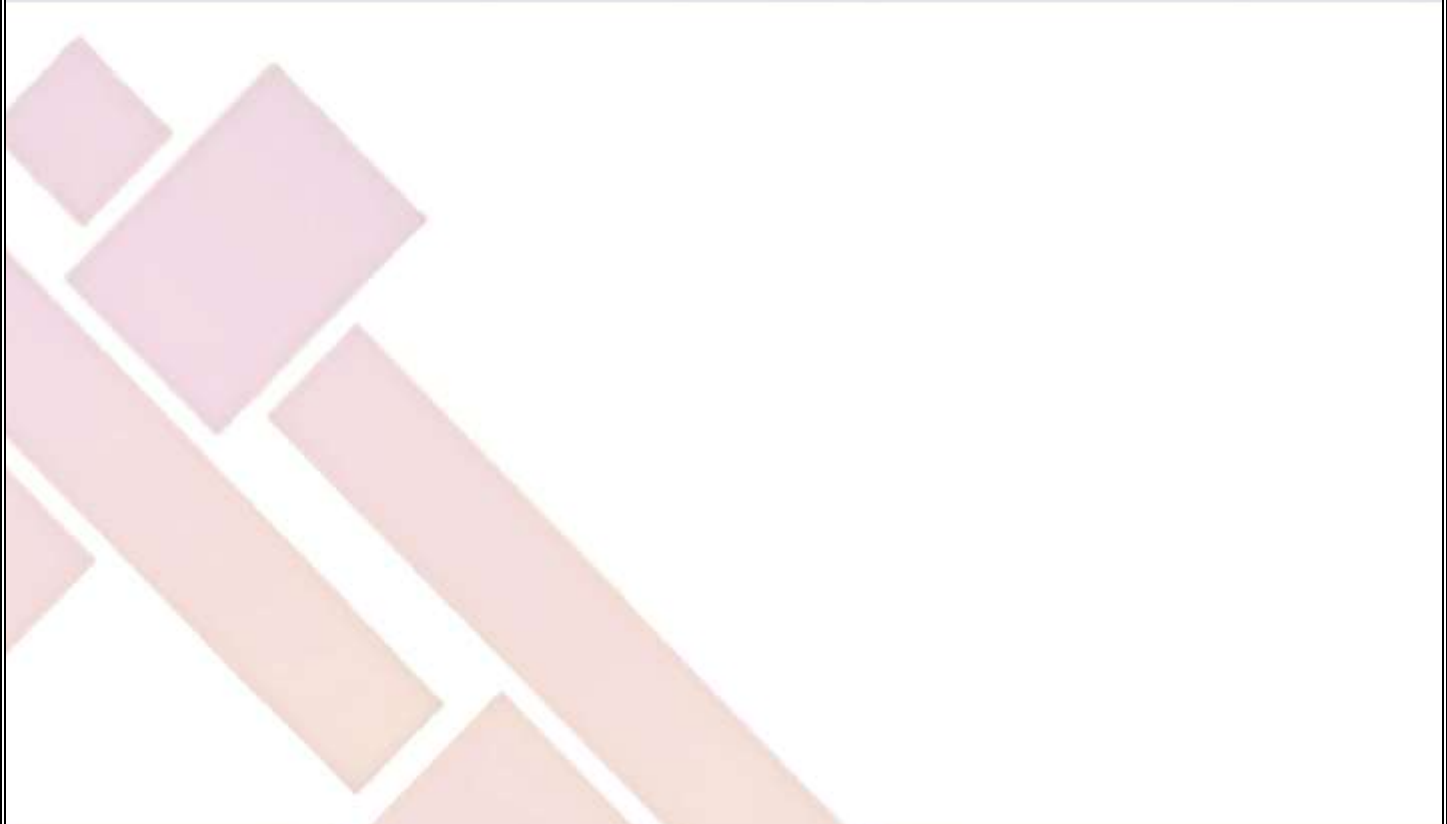
