

### TO PARENTS AND TEACHERS:

Children learn to read in a variety of ways: through formal teaching in school, by being read aloud to at home, and by reading on their own, using all the tools they've learned for making sense of letters and words. The process starts with a child's first awareness that letters on the page form words, which make sentences, which make stories. No one method of learning is right for every child, but all children need books they can read successfully.

Ready-to-Read books feature stories by authors who really know how to write for this age group. They're grouped at four levels:


- Pre-Level One, with repetitive text and simple sentences for children who can recognize words
- -Level One, with an expanded vocabulary and longer sentences for children who are just starting to read. Some Level One books also use rebus icons to further help readers.
- Level Two, for those who are reading independently and are ready for slightly greater challenges
- Level Three, for children who can read on their own, with fewer illustrations and longer texts

At each level the books are all written, designed, and illustrated to suit the interests, needs, and abilities of new readers.

Children in preschool and the early elementary grades are universally fascinated with reading, and are already saying, "I'm ready to read." When they finish a **Ready-to-Read** book, we want them to say, "I am reading, and I like it!"
