Tips for reading together

Talk together

- Look at the cover of the book together and read the title. Ask: What might a magic paintbrush be able to do?
- Look at page 2 where Ho is introduced. Ask: What sort of work does Ho have to do?
- Explain that Ho lived in China a long time ago.


About the words in this story

- Your child will be able to read most of the words in this story using their phonics skills. Encourage your child to sound out and blend any new words.
- These words are common, but your child may find them tricky.

made looked people If necessary, read these words to your child.

During reading

- Encourage your child to read the story to you. Talk about the pictures with your child as they read
- Encourage your child to say the sounds in a word, from left to right. Tell them to point to the sounds as they say them. Then they can blend the sounds into a whole word. e.g. p-ai-n-t-b-r-u-sh, j-ai-l.
- Give your child lots of time to sound out each word.
- Re-read the sentence encouraging your child to read with expression.
- Notice punctuation, such as exclamation marks, and that they affect how you say something.
- Look out for repeated phrases, e.g. The ... became real!




The Magic Paintbrush





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




The farmer did not pay him much. Ho had only dry bread to eat.














"Oi, you! The paintbrush does not work for me. Paint me a mountain of gold!" ordered the farmer.






Ho painted the mountain of gold. He painted a blue sea all around it. The gold and the sea became real.









The farmer set off in the ship.

I want. The world will be mine!" he laughed.








Ho returned to the farm. He painted things for those who were kind and good to others.

☐ Tips for retelling the story

Talk about the story

- Look at the farmer on page 10. Ask: What do you think he was thinking?
- Find three or four kind things that Ho did to help people.
- Ask: Why did the farmer put Ho in jail?
- Ask: Can you think of anything else Ho could have painted to trick the bad farmer?

Retell the story using the story map

- Now you have read the story and talked about it, use the story map on page 24 to retell the story together. Each picture shows an important part of the story.
- Encourage your child to retell the story in their own words. You could do this together or take it in turns to tell different parts of it.
- As you retell the story, encourage your child to use descriptive words to add more detail, e.g. He took heavy, dusty hay to the field in the hot sun.

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
