

PROVERB	All good things must come to an end		
MEANING	Everything ends; good times don't last forever		
EXAMPLE	"I wish this vacation would go on forever. It's too bad that

PROVERB	A picture is worth a thousand words		
MEANING	An image can tell a story better than words		
EXAMPLE	"I wasn't sure that he loved her, but then I saw them		
	hugging at the airport. A picture is worth a thousand words."		

PROVERB A watched pot never boils If something takes time to do, it doesn't help to constantly **MEANING** check on it. You just have to give it time. "I know you think he's going to be a great guitar player one EXAMPLE day, but stop criticizing him so much. He just started taking lessons two weeks ago! A watched pot never boils." PROVERB Beggars can't be choosers If you're in a bad situation and someone offers to help you, MEANING you have to take whatever they give you and shouldn't ask for more "I was unemployed, and they offered me a job cleaning EXAMPLE prison toilet. I didn't like the job, but I accepted it. Beggars can't be choosers." PROVERB Beauty is in the eye of the beholder MEANING What is "beautiful" is different for each person "I think their house is ugly, but they seem to like it. Beauty EXAMPLE is in the eye of the beholder." PROVERB Better late than never MEANING It's better to finish something late than to never do it at all "Hello, Mr. Jameson. Here is my final essay. Better late than EXAMPLE never, right?" PROVERB Birds of a feather flock together MEANING People who are similar spend time together "I think we all started hanging out because we all liked EXAMPLE anime. Birds of a feather flock together." PROVERB Cleanliness is next to godliness

EXAMPLE "Go take a shower before your date. You know what they

MEANING It's good to be clean. God is clean, and you should be too.

say; cleanliness	s is next to	godliness."
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PROVERB Don't bite the hand that feeds you

MEANING Don't make someone angry or hurt someone who is helping you or paying for you

EXAMPLE "You had a fight with your boss? Are you stupid? Don't bite the hand that feeds you."

PROVERB Don't count your chickens before they hatch.

MEANING Don't expect a positive result before you actually see it

A: "This idea is going to make me millions of dollars!"

EXAMPLE B: "Whoa. Let's slow down. Don't count your chickens before they hatch."

PROVERB Don't judge a book by its cover

MEANING Don't judge someone or something by appearance alone

EXAMPLE "Racism is still a problem today, and it will continue to be that way until we learn not to judge a book by its cover."

PROVERB Don't put all of your eggs in one basket

MEANING Don't put all of your hopes and resources into one goal or dream

"I know you really want to be an actor, but don't you think

EXAMPLE you're being financially irresponsible? Don't put all of your eggs in one basket."

PROVERB Don't put off until tomorrow what you can do today

MEANING

If you can do something today, do it. Don't wait until tomorrow; don't procrastinate.

"You have 6 hours of free time now. You should start on

EXAMPLE that final psychology assignment. Don't put off until tomorrow what you can do today."

PROVERB Don't put too many irons in the fire

Don't try to do too many things at the same time; focus on **MEANING** one thing at a time "No wonder you're exhausted. You're trying to work 4 jobs EXAMPLE at the same time! You have too many irons in the fire right now." PROVERB Easy come, easy go When you make money quickly, it's very easy to lose it **MEANING** quickly as well "I won \$200 at the casino, and then I spent it on a very EXAMPLE expensive meal for me and some friends. Easy come, easy go." PROVERB Fortune favors the bold People who are brave and who take risks are more MEANING successful than people who are do things safely all the time "It's a risk, but the reward could be great. I say you go for it. **EXAMPLE** Fortune favors the bold." PROVERB God helps those who help themselves Don't just wait for good things to happen to you. Work hard **MEANING** to make them happen "If you want a better life, you can't just sit on your butt EXAMPLE thinking about it. You have to work to make it happen. God helps those who help themselves." PROVERB Good things come to those who wait MEANING If you are patient, good things can happen "I know you're hungry, but stop being so impatient. We just EXAMPLE ordered our food. Good things come to those who wait." PROVERB Honesty is the best policy

MEANING It's always better to tell the truth than it is to lie

"If you want people to trust you, you need to be honest with **EXAMPLE** them. Honesty is the best policy." PROVERB Hope for the best, prepare for the worst In any situation, be optimistic about the result, but always **MEANING** be ready for the worst outcome "We're going on vacation next week. It's supposed to rain a EXAMPLE lot, so we're bringing our umbrellas and a bunch of board games. Hope for the best, prepare for the worst." PROVERB If it ain't broke, don't fix it If something is already working well, don't try to change it **MEANING** or improve it "Why are you trying to upgrade your PC again? It was EXAMPLE working fine before. If it ain't broke, don't fix it." If you can't beat 'em, join 'em PROVERB If you can't change someone's behavior or opinion, **MEANING** sometimes it's better or easier to do what they want to do "I told Mark that we needed to study, but he kept playing EXAMPLE video games. Eventually I gave up and just played video games too. If you can't beat 'em, join 'em." PROVERB If you play with fire, you'll get burned If you get involved in something dangerous or beyond your MEANING abilities, you will probably experience negative consequences "Don't make him angry. If you play with fire, you'll get EXAMPLE burned." If you want something done right, you have to do it **PROVERB** yourself MEANING Don't depend on someone else to do a good job; do it

yourself

"I asked my roommate to wash the dishes, but they ended up

EXAMPLE super filthy! I guess it's true what they say: if you want something done right, you have to do it yourself."

PROVERB Keep your friends close, and your enemies closer

MEANING If someone is your enemy, treat them like a friend so you can be ready if they ever try to betray you

"We don't trust each other, but we have to be nice to each other because we work for the same company. I'm worried

EXAMPLE about him stealing my promotion, so I'm going to keep being nice to him. Keep your friends close, but your enemies closer, and all that."

PROVERB Knowledge is power

The more you know, the more powerful you can be in different areas of your life

"When we were kids, our parents taught us how to swim.

EXAMPLE That knowledge helped me to save my cousin's life when he was 5 years old. Knowledge is power."

PROVERB Laughter is the best medicine.

When you're in a difficult situation, laughing can make it easier to get through that situation

Under the sheikh's hat is a monkey. (Used to criticize someone who tries to appear good on the outside to cover up their faults, specifically if they try to appear pious.)

Underneath the nice exterior is a bunch of problems. (Used to criticize someone who tries to put up a good appearance to cover up their faults.)

Stretch your legs as far as your blanket extends. (Don't live beyond your means.)

He who burns his tongue from soup will blow in yogurt (to cool it). (Once burned, twice shy.)

You want what you want and he wants what he wants, but God does what He wants. (Man proposes, God disposes.)

Someone with their ass exposed likes to criticize. (Used in reference to hypocrites). Note the crude language in this saying, so be careful who you say it around.

I say it's a bull, he says milk it. (Used when you're talking at cross-purposes with someone who won't see reason.)

The eye doesn't go higher than the brow. (No one can go above their status in life.)

The miserable person will be miserable even if you hang a lantern on his head. (You can't escape your luck.)

Better a warm welcome than being invited to lunch. (Welcoming people warmly is important.)

The imam farted, so those praying behind him shitted. (A leader's errors are compounded by his followers.) Again, this saying uses crude language, so you should be careful who you say it around.

One who cooks poison tastes it. (What goes around comes around.)

Why should one who finds someone to cook for him burn his fingers? (Don't do your own dirty work if you can find someone to do it for you.)

Eat him for lunch before he eats you for dinner. (Kill him before he kills you; get your blow in first.)

The cat only likes its strangler. (People only respond to harsh treatment.)

The fan will donate his skullcap. (An enthusiast will give away everything he has for what he loves.)

Movement is a blessing. (Exercise is good.)

A wasp that brought about the destruction of its own nest through its buzzing. (He asked for it, it was his own fault.)

Like mother, like daughter.

Similar to the above, used to describe someone's similarity to one of their parents.

"this cub (is) from that lion."

A loss soon is better than a victory much later. (It's better to cut your losses and admit defeat quickly rather than stick it out and eventually win a victory that cost you a lot.)

A beggar but acting like a rich man. (Used to describe someone who's in no position to be picky but is still acting like he can set the terms of whatever bargain etc. is going on. Sort of like the equivalent of "Beggars can't be choosers," but in reverse.)

A beggar, and he wants a (whole) loaf. (If you're relying on other people's generosity, you should just be grateful for whatever you can get instead of complaining you didn't get more.)

The bad student's excuse is erasing the blackboard. (Used to describe people who are trying to divert attention from their own failings by talking about other things.)

Some people's disasters provide benefits for other people. (What is disastrous for some people can prove to be advantageous for other people.)

What is coming is better than what is gone. (The future is better than what's past; used to cheer people up.)

"If" is like trying to hold onto the air (i.e. something impossible). (The equivalent of

"If wishes were horses"; if someone is talking about what they'd do if they were a millionaire, or something else impossible, you can tell them the above proverb to remind them that just wishing for things is pointless.)

The wicked or naughty live longer. (Can be used to hint that if you take risks, it'll pay off. Can also be used in a joking way; for example, if a friend was in a minor car accident and was uninjured, you could tell them this proverb.

He got entangled in the evil of his own doings. (He was hoisted by his own petard fell into his own trap, was harmed by his own plan to harm someone else.)

The believer is afflicted. (The righteous always suffer.)

The new sieve is taut. (A new broom sweeps clean.)

Make an effort, and I'll make an effort [to help] you. (God helps those who help themselves.)

It's always the idiots who have [lots of] money. (Used to disparage the rich.)

The water gives the lie to the diver. (The proof's in the pudding.)

Ignorance is bliss.

It's all the same thing to those who know nothing. Used if someone views different things as if they're all the same. (It's all soap to the Bedouins.)

The eye sees, but the arm is short (cannot reach). Said when someone wishes for something beyond his means.

A basket has two handles needs two people to carry it. (Many hands make light work.)



Learning proverbs can also help you to understand the way that people in English-speaking cultures think about the world.

The most important English Proverbs

This is a list of some of the most important and well-known English proverbs. Below each one, there's a simple explanation.

The meanings of some of these phrases have shifted over the years, so a proverb might have originally had a different meaning than the one I explain.

1. "Two wrongs don't make a right."

When someone has done something bad to you, trying to get revenge will only make things worse.

2. "The pen is mightier than the sword."

Trying to convince people with ideas and words is more effective than trying to force people to do what you want.

3. "When in Rome, do as the Romans."

Act the way that the people around you are acting. This phrase might come in handy when you're traveling abroad notice that people do things differently than you're used to.

4. "The squeaky wheel gets the grease."

You can get better service if you complain about something. If you wait patiently, no one's going to help you.

5. "When the going gets tough, the tough get going."

Strong people don't give up when they come across challenges. They just work harder.

6. "No man is an island."
